the holidays. We wish you a very Merry Christmas, Happy Holidays, and a Happy New Year to all!



\$ You have a website that summarizes who we are and references previous Newsletters if you want to look up information or direct a potential member to see what we are about. (www.greenwichclub.org)


\$ You avoid guest fees.
