


Old Rhinebeck Aerodrome



From I-95 north: Exit 8, turn left on Atlantic St. then right on Tresser Blvd./U.S. 1 N. Follow U.S. 1 N just past Champion Plaza.The Rich Forum Box Office is on the left. Go up the hill. Turn left onto Glenbrook Road. Walgreens is on the corner. At the split, stay straight to go onto Hope Street. 348 is on the left. From I-95 south: Exit 9, right on U.S. 1/East Main, 1st right onto Courtland Ave./CT 106, follow to end, turn left onto Glenbrook Road,

stay straight to Church Street (with church on your right). Turn right onto Hope Street. 368 is on the left.

From I-95 north: Take exit 6/Harvard Ave. At end of ramp, go straight one block. Turn left at next light onto West Ave., go straight across Post Road, then bear left around the island, turning onto Stillwater Ave. Continue on Stillwater about 1/8 mi. On your right you will see the golf course. Turn into the parking lot. From I-95 south: turn right off of exit 6 onto West Ave., then follow the directions above.

We will provide some beverages and ice. Limited fast food items are for sale, but we encourage you to pack your own lunch. Also bring a snack or drink to share and a folding chair or cushion on which to sit while we eat. After lunch, you may wish to tour the museums and grounds.

Also available are twenty minute rides over the Hudson Valley in a 1929 biplane. These are on a first come/first served basis @\$75 each. It is highly recommended that you sign up immediately upon arrival if interested. Be ready to don goggles and leather helmet as you sit in an open cockpit for this 'terrifying' thrill.

Primary attraction is the air show which begins at 2pm and lasts until 4 pm. We will sit on wooden bleachers so you may want to use your cushion here also.



If you want dinner on the way home, we can suggest several restaurants in historic Rhinebeck which is a few miles south of the Aerodrome on Rte 9 which easily leads back to the Taconic.
