

January 14: The Hare with Amber Eyes by Edmund de Waal. Edmund de Waal is a world-famous ceramicist. Having spent thirty years making beautiful pots—which are then sold, collected, and handed on—he has a particular sense of the secret

lives of objects. When he inherited a collection of 264 tiny Japanese wood and ivory carvings, called netsuke, he wanted to know who had touched and held them, and how the collection had managed to survive. And so begins this extraordinarily moving memoir and detective story as de Waal discovers both the story of the netsuke and of his family, the Ephrussis, over five generations.



February 11: Girls of Atomic City: The Untold Story of the Women Who Helped Win World War II, by Denise Kiernan. At the height of WWII, Oak Ridge, Tenn., was home to 75,000 residents, consuming more electricity than New York City. But to most of

the world, the town did not exist. Thousands of civilians—many of them young women from small towns across the South—were recruited to this secret city, enticed by solid wages and the promise of war-ending work. Kept very much in the dark, few would ever guess the true nature of the tasks they performed each day in the hulking factories in the middle of the Appalachian Mountains. That is, until the end of the war—when Oak Ridge's secret was revealed.

Merritt Pkwy: Exit 35, rte 137, (High Ridge Road). From southbound, turn right toward downtown Stamford. Go under Parkway Bridge and turn left at light. (Buxton Farms Road). From northbound, go straight across the intersection onto Buxton Farms Road. At stop sign turn right onto River Road and left onto Intervale Road. At top of hill turn right onto Newfield Ave. Sterling Farms Golf Course driveway is first left.

I-95: Exit 8. From southbound, turn right onto Elm Street. From Northbound, go straight three lights and turn left under the highway onto Elm Street. Follow Elm Street as it becomes Grove Street and Grove, then Strawberry Hill Ave., then Newfield Ave. About 1.4 miles from Newfield Green shopping center, you will pass the light at Weed Hill Ave. The Sterling Farms Golf Course driveway is about 1/2 mile from the light, on the right.

Take the 1st right onto Sound Beach Ave. (just past the Getty Mart on the corner). If you reach Boulder Ave. you've gone about 0.1 mile too far. Mackenzie's is on the left just before the train tracks.
