Directions: From I-95 northbound - take Atlantic St. exit 8 – turn left onto Atlantic St. From I-95 southbound – take Atlantic St. exit 7 onto State St. – turn right onto Atlantic St. Atlantic St becomes Bedford St. Restaurant is on the left at 188 Bedford St., on the corner of Spring St., near the Avon Theater. If no on-street parking is available, turn left onto Spring Street to enter the parking lot behind the restaurant.

From I-95 (North or South): Take exit 5, theUS-1 N exit, toward Stamford/Old Greenwich. Turn right onto E. Putnam Ave./US-1. CVS Pharmacy in Riverside Commons is on the corner. Take the 1st right onto Sound Beach Ave. (just past the Getty Mart on the corner). If you reach Boulder Ave. you've gone about

0.1 mile too far. Mackenzie's is on the left just before the train tracks.

From I-95 north: Take exit 6/Harvard Ave. At end of ramp, go straight one block. Turn left at next light onto West Ave., go straight across Post Road, then bear left around the island, turning onto Stillwater Ave. Continue on Stillwater about 1/8 mi. On your right you will see the golf course. Turn into the parking lot. From I-95 south: turn right off of exit 6 onto West Ave., then follow the directions above.
